



## ACCOMPLISHMENT NARRATIVE REPORT January to September 2024

The Center for Community Development and Extension Services has been continuously implementing the Vision, Mission and Objectives of the Urdaneta City University Center for Community Development and Extension Services. With the significant support of the UCU administration, colleges, various departments and students' organization, we were able to meet the expected outputs with an impressive impact from the beneficiaries and partner communities. Truly, the motto "Sama-sama, tulong-tulong Para lisang Layunin" always leads to an enormous results.

During the early month of the year and quarterly thereafter, Extension Coordinators meeting was conducted and reviewed the previous implementations and outputs conducted university wide and by each colleges/department. The preparation of re-entry plan was highly emphasized as basis and guide on the 2024 project implementation. The CCEDS staff and extension coordinators conducted courtesy call and coordination with the adopted schools for the continuous partnership and implementation of various extension projects that we have undergone. Below are the significant programs and activities that the CCEDS together with various colleges and departments have accomplished from January to September, 2024:

### a) Continuation of the adopt-a-school project

College of Pharmacy Extension activities at Oltama Elementary School

- \* Orientation on the rights of a child
- \* Distribution of vitamins to all school children
- \* Feeding program

College of Business Management and Accountancy – Labit West Elementary School

- \* Distribution of piggy bank to school children grades 4,5 and 6
- \* Provided learnings on financial management and savings for young learners

College of Hospitality and Tourism Management – Don Clemente Blanco Memorial Elementary School, Sugcong, U.C.

- \* Continuation of their extension project, fixing the Culinary Garden, provided seedlings and gardening materials for the school garden
- \* Nanay's livelihood training program on Rice wine making and Puto production

College of Engineering and Architecture – DAPSMECS Annex, San Vicente, U.C.

- \* Orientation of parents on environmental protection
- \* Feeding program
- \* Provided school supplies

College of Teacher Education

- \* Literacy project for the school children
- \* Feeding program

### b) Leadership Capability Training at Cabaruan National High School, Labit National High School and Palina East National High School, whereby officers and members of the student organization from grade 7 to 12 have undergone sessions on moral values and character building, public speaking, leadership and decision making, self-awareness and team building activities. Based on the impact analysis conducted, the students claimed that they have improved their potentials as young leaders with a very high indicator:

- Knowledge – improved their comprehensions and technicalities on public speaking Skills, responsive with their duties and responsibilities as a student leader as well as self-esteem and camaraderie with other students.
- Values - improved their moral values and character building, camaraderie among co-participants/beneficiaries, developed self-worthy and able to respect one-self and others, limited the time of unproductive/destructive activities creating personal differences, attitude of becoming a responsible student of our school and community



- Skills - honed their skills in improving leadership capacities and decision making, confident in public speaking or interacting with other, learned how to improve self-esteem and able to relate themselves confidently with other students, capable of dealing with problems and cordial concerns with other, sharing the good moral values of a responsible student
- \* The LCT Year 2 project proposal was approved and it will be conducted at Anonas National High School and P.T. Orata National High School, beneficiaries are the officers and members of the student government organization from grades 7 to 12. A MOA signing was scheduled on the first week of October prior to the conduct of training on the third week of October.
- c) **Panagtaripatto Kadagiti Agtutubo (PTO)** – The project started September, 2023 and various colleges have rendered learning activities that helped the students assess their interest and guided them on their career pathways on what course they will enroll on their college education. Majority of the students choose to enroll at UCU. Below are the colleges who were scheduled to provide the learning activities:
  - \* Learning activities administered by College of Information Technology Education, “Leadership Techquest Journey of Technological Empowerment for Youth” at Cabaruan National High School. It is a 2-day (April 23 and 26) session focuses on the history of Information technology given by Mr. Elmer Carreon, Faculty and the second topic was on Multimedia Technology with sample outputs of the students, discussed by Mdm. Shiela Marie Gonzaga, Faculty. The students acquired knowledge in using different apps on their cellphones and computers and how to use these apps on their studies.
  - \* Learning activities rendered by College of Health Sciences headed by Mdm. Alyssa Ashley Diego, Acting Dean, Mr. Roniel Aquino, Extension Coordinator, other faculties and Nursing students. The theme of the activity is “Physical Changes: A Pubertal Tour Towards Mental and Social Wellness”, whereby the faculty speakers discussed to the grade 11 and 12 students the challenges they are passing through on the puberty stage.
  - \* PTO 3 project proposal was approved and it will be implemented at Don Alipio Ferandez Sr., MOA signing and Needs Assessment will be conducted on October 8, 2024
- d) **58 nga Namnama Project** with theme “Kalusugang Pansarili: Mental, Emosyonal at Espiritwal Linangin”. Participants are the 79 students from grade 11 and 12 of Labit National High School. The activity gave opportunities for the youths to be given “Namnama”, a hope to hone their skills, knowledge and aspirations in life as well as inculcate ethical conduct. The project was conducted last February 28, 2024 as part of the 58<sup>th</sup> founding anniversary of Urdaneta City University. A video presentation on “Father’s Love” followed by sharing of wisdom and spiritual thoughts by Rev. Christopher Ian Bulac, NSTP faculty, lectures and team building activity on self-awareness by Mdm. Monette Locquiao and Mrs. Vilma L. Lapitan, and giving thanks lecture by Dr. Jerry C. Dichoso.
- e) **Training on After-care Management of Children with Cognitive and Defined Behavior**
  - \* The project was conducted to enable parents of children with cognitive and defined behaviors, barangay stakeholders and teachers in the assessment and proper management of children through coordination, assistance to proper care and teaching of children to become socially, physically and emotionally productive. Eight (8) schools were benefited and their parents actively participated during the training/orientation. Speakers are from the Psychological Assessment and Counseling Center, Mdm. Lorelie Gayo, CAS faculty and Mrs. Vilma Lapitan, RSW. As per result of the evaluation feedback, parents were able to gain knowledge and understanding in the stress management of their children and tips in dealing with their children. Launching program was held at Vicente Taaca Memorial School and other trainings/orientation were conducted simultaneously during the Brigada Eskwela project.



- f) **Badang Brigada Eskwela Year 4** - this project was rated very relevant and effective intervention in welcoming the school children with a child friendly facility as per evaluation feedback conducted to the teaching force and parents of the 15 adopted schools. Interventions provided are the following:
- \* Clean-up drive, cleaning of the school surroundings, classrooms, ceiling and wall fans and inspection of electrical installation and repair of chairs. Ensured that the school children and high school students have safe classrooms and clean facilities.
  - \* Provision of school supplies to the needy school children, 60 packs per school from grades 1 to 6, a total of 927 pupils were benefited. Donation of 6 reams of coupon bonds for the office supplies to Cabaruan National High School and Labit National High School. School supplies donated was raised through the school donation drive conducted in the university.
  - \* Orientation of parents on the management of stress of their school children, enable the parents understand and manage the behaviors of their children.
  - \* Earthquake drill and lecture on disaster management to the school children conducted by the 2<sup>nd</sup> PMFC and UCU Disaster Management office. Preparing the children to become disaster resilient while in school or at home.
- The Badang project started last the whole month of June whereby we started coordinating with the colleges and partner stakeholders on the school donation drive. Various school supplies were received by the office and total cash of Php. 29,325.00 were received by the office. A total of 927 school packs were given, each pack consist of 2 pcs. Notebooks, 2 pcs. Pad papers, 2 pcs. Pencil, 2 pcs. Ballpen, crayons, erasers and sharpener and a plastic envelope. The Badang Brigada Eskwela kick-off program was held at Labit West Elementary School last July 11, 2024 and ended August, 2024 at Sta Lucia Elementary School.
- g) **Badang: Bayanihan sa Unibersidad, Para sa Malinis na Pasilidad Year 3** – The project was made last August 6, 2024, a Kick-off program of “Barangayanihan sa Unibersidad: Para sa Malinis na Pasilidad Year 3” at UCU quadrangle participated by various colleges and departments together with the University Student Council and Student Government Organization. A simple program was conducted with special messages from the CCDES Director, Jerry C. Dichoso and VP for Academic Affairs, Dr. Josephine S. Lambinico. A Zumba workout was headed by SGO officers to increase the enthusiasm of the student volunteers together with the college faculties. The Barangayanihan project aims to instill the spirit of volunteerism among UCU faculties and personnel and student organization in preparing the university with student friendly facilities on the coming opening of classes on August 12, 2024.

#### **Future Projects for the last Quarter of 2024**

- Sept. 16, 2024 - Prepared o Project Proposal Re: War on Waste for implementation on October 2024 and onwards. The CCDES office and College of Criminal Justice Education will lead the War on Waste project enjoining the students in protecting and caring the environment. A kick off program will be conducted on October 4, 2024 followed by clean-up drive around the university vicinity. The WOW will be conducted every Thursday morning of the week
- Sept. 17, 2024 - Prepared Project Proposal Re: Badang Pasinaya Para Kay Lolo at Lola Year 5 for project implementation on December, 2024. A gift giving project for all senior citizens of barangay Labit West, Urdaneta City. Each colleges/department will raise funds for the grocery items and will be submitted at CCEDS office for repacking.
- Sept. 30, 2024 - Prepared Project Proposal Re: UCU Employees Sportsfest 2024 with the theme “GAD Unity in Motion: Inclusive Sports and Wellness for UCU Employees”. A project promoting the wellness, self and social enhancement among the male and female employees of the UCU that intends to sportsmanship and solidarity and healthy lifestyle. The project will be conducted from October to December, 2024



- PTO 3 project proposal was approved and it will be implemented at Don Alipio Fernandez Sr., MOA signing and Needs Assessment will be conducted on October 8, 2024
- The LCT Year 2 project proposal was approved and it will be conducted at Anonas National High School and P.T. Orata National High School, beneficiaries are the officers and members of the student government organization from grades 7 to 12.

- **College of Health Sciences** - All the college faculty and 4<sup>th</sup> year students have actively participated on the extension and outreach activities. They have conducted extension/outreach programs during the National Family Planning Month and Badang Brigada Eskwela clean-up and Gamit Eskwela Para sa Bata at Camanang Elementary School and barangay Camanang, their adopted school and barangay. They conducted learning activity session on “Physical Changes: A Pubertal Tour Towards Mental and Social Wellness” to Junior and Senior High School beneficiaries of the Pinagtaripatto Kadagiti Agtutubo Project 2 at Cabaruan National High School. The college also supported the school donation drive, whereby they donated school supplies derive from the donations of students and faculties. A 90 % percent rate of their participation on the extension/outreach projects of the university have contributed on the success of the projects. The college of midwifery shared their knowledge and skills during the NSTP TECHVOC - Medical and health mission at Sitio Leet, San Jose. (please see attached attendance and documentations)

- **College of Teacher Education** – 85% participated in the Badang Brigada Eskwela, and Badang School Donation Drive, and Barangayanihan sa Unibersidad project. The officers and members of the student organization and students gave cash donations and purchased school supplies, as well as the feeding program during the Brigada Eskwela at Bactad Community School, their adopted school. - **College of Hospitality and Tourism Management** – the faculty, personnel and students of the college are constantly participating the extension and outreach programs. They are continuously extending interventions on their adopted school, the Don Clemente Blanco Memorial Elementary School, barangay Sugcong, U.C. such as the Badang Brigada Eskwela clean-up drive and the Culinary Garden whereby they donated construction materials and seedlings and maintained by the school janitor. The vegetables being produced is for the feeding program of the school children. The extension coordinator together with some of the faculty and students conducted training on puto making and rice wine making to the parents that they could use for their income generating activities. In terms of in-school outreach projects, the students and faculty shared their workforce on the Barangayanihan Para sa Malinis na Unibersidad and WOW project. Further, they have donated two big boxes of various schools supplies for the Badang School Donation Drive came from the donations of the students. As per attendances, documentations and list of donations the college have 80% rate of participation. (pls refer to the attached attendance, donations and pictures submitted by the college)

- **College of Information Technology Education** – The college faculty, personnel and students assisted their adopted school, Labit National High School, Labit, Urdaneta City on the various projects, Badang Brigada Eskwela clean up drive and donated 60 school envelope containing pad papers, notebooks, ballpen to the students. Partnership with the 2<sup>nd</sup> PMFC and provided 2-day trainings “Project Police” to the police officers on various computer apps necessary on the office and operations





of the Force Company. All instructors of the college shared their expertise on the training. They conducted learning activities of the Panagtaripatto Kadagiti Agtutubo Project Year 2 participated by the 78 students of the Cabaruan National High School They supported the Barangayanihan sa Unibersidad and WOW project, wherein their students participated on the clean-up drive.
