For the Year 2023, we started with a Program Review and Planning last January 13, 2023 participated by Extension Coordinators of the various departments and colleges. A roll call was made and there are new Extension Coordinators endorsed by their respective Deans. An approved endorsement from the COO office on the official extension coordinators and copy furnished the deans and departments of all colleges and departments. The CCDES office have conducted quarterly meetings (January 13, April 20, June 2, September 7 and November 28) with the Extension Coordinators for the purpose of monitoring and updating accomplishments conducted such as the Needs and Assessment Survey (NAS) which is very essential in the extension programs. The result of the NAS is the basis in providing extension programs in the adopted schools and communities as well leading to the conduct of research. For planning purposes whereby, we discussed the programs and projects to be conducted. The College of Teacher Education, College of Information Technology Education, and College of Hospitality and Tourism Management have presented their NAS, its findings and programs to be conducted in their adopted schools. Dr. Jerry Dichoso presented the 2022 Accomplishments and expressed his gratitude to all the colleges and departments who unselfishly shared their full support. He also presented the CCDES Plan for 2023, the Adopt-a- School project whereby all colleges and department are given schools to adopt:

A) Adopt-a-School Project:

The objective of the adopt-a-school project, is to enable the adoptive college/department implement a sustainable programs, projects and activities in the schools. For the first quarter, the following are the activities to be conducted:

- a) Coordination with the school heads for the adop-a -school project together with the CCDES staff and concerned extension coordinator
- b) MOA signing between the UCU and School with the barangay captain, FPTA president and School Government Council
- c) Conduct of Needs and Assessment Survey in the school and barangay to further assess the needs of the school
- d) Submission of Re-entry Plan for 2023
- e) Prepared Project Proposal
- f) Research

A courtesy call and coordination at the office of the City Schools Division Superintendent, Dr. Aguedo Fernadez was undertaken and discussed to him the Adopt-a-School project of the university and the participation of UCU personnel and faculty on the call of the Dep. Education on Brigada Eskwela. The good City Division Superintendent have appreciated the adopt-a-school project and he issued a Memorandum to the adopted schools. Coordination with the School Principals was conducted and have scheduled the MOA signing. The MOA signing was conducted on the adopted schools from February to April 13, 2023:

B) Project Namnama

The project Namnama continues with the theme: Idu-as ti Paglaingan Dagiti Agtutubo, held at Cabaruan Elementary School with 97 pupil beneficiaries from grades 5 and 6. The project is a collaboration of CCDES, CSLD, and PACC and attended by various extension coordinators and Dr. Josephine S. Lambinico, VP for Academic Affairs. The 97 pupils underwent team-building activities introduced by the staff of Psychological Assessment and Counseling Center that hone their leadership skills and experienced camaraderie and rapport, improved their potentials to become young leaders. Project Namnama is part of the weeklong 57th Founding Anniversary of the UCU with the theme “Activating Infinite Potentials”. Funding support for the project is under the UCU funds and the children were given t-shirts commemorating the theme of the University.

C) Badang Brigada Eskwela

The Badang Brigada Eskwela Project Year 3 was successfully implemented through the effort of faculty, staff, and personnel of various colleges and departments of Urdaneta City University. A Project Proposal was prepared and approved by the Office of the University President as the basis of the project implementation that started the month of June 2023. The Badang Brigada Eskwela Project was composed of three activities:

- a) Badang School Donation Drive, wherein we solicited in-cash and in-kind school supplies from outside sponsors and from the various colleges/departments. We were able to raise an amount of Php. 48,721.00 and various school supplies. We were able to pack a total of 660 pieces for kinder and grades 1 to 6 pupils, and 18 reams of coupon bond for Labit National High School, Palina East National High School, and Cabaruan National High School. The school supply pack contains three pieces of pad paper, two notebooks, an eraser, sharpener, two pencils/ ballpens, crayon, and a plastic envelope.
- b) Badang Clean-up drive- Once again we have proven the unity and full support of faculties and personnel in pursuing the objectives of the Badang project in the call of the Dep. Of Education Brigada Eskwela project preparing child-friendly facilities. Inspection of electrical installations, electrical facilities and plumbing and cleaning of classrooms electric fans was conducted by the EMAS, GSO and SMO staff, Library organization by the university librarians while repainting and cleaning of classrooms and school surroundings was conducted by the personnels and faculties.
- c) Badang Pagbasa – the adoptive colleges prepared learning activities on “Pagbasa” for grades 4, 5, and 6 promoting the love of reading, comprehension, and storytelling. The pagbasa project was maintained by the College of Teacher Education at Bactad Community School and out 29 pupils with low literacy, 28 of them improved.

To formally implement the project, the CCDES staff made a courtesy call to Dr. Aguedo Fernandez, Schools Division Superintendent, and discussed with him the objective of the BADANG project and the adopted 10 Elementary schools and 3 high schools. Although the Dep. Education Brigada Eskwela's schedule is on August 14-18, 2023, we managed the Badang Brigada Eskwela project from August 7 to 11, 2023. The good superintendent issued a memo to the principals of the 13 schools informing the schedule of the project. Dr. Aguedo Fernandez and the school principals expressed their gratitude to the UCU Badang Project for its virtuous and novel project.

The participating faculties and personnel showed the value of volunteerism and gave their efforts to assist the schools in preparing conducive facilities for school children. Cleaning of school facilities/classrooms, re-painting of classrooms and blackboards, an inspection of electrical facilities, and cleaning of electric fans were made by the staff from Engineering Management and Auxiliary Service, Security Management Office, and General Services Office. The colleges of CITE, CAS, and CBMA donated cleaning and painting materials, while the colleges of CHTM, CEA, and COP provided snacks, additional school supplies, and hygiene aides for the children.

A kick-off program was conducted at Tiposu Elementary School, barangay Tiposu, Urdaneta City last August 11, 2023, participated by the extension coordinators, Dr. Josephine Lambinico, VP for Academic Affairs, and Dr. Raquel Pascua, VP for Administrative Affairs, Dean Princess Sarah Quintana, and Dr. Jerry C. Dichoso shared their inspirational messages on the desire of the UCU assist the adopted schools. A closing program was held at the DAPSMES Annex last August 11, 2023, participated by the officers of the UCU Alumni Inc. Each adoptive college together with their student organizations was in charged on the given schedule of their adoptive schools with the assistance of EMAS, GSO, SGO, and other departments with the supervision of the CCDES office. This mere project of the UCU – CCDES project means a lot, showing the unity and support of everyone whereby the word “BADANG” means to assist/help other institutions such as the schools of Urdaneta City in providing quality educational facilities to our learners.

D) Panagtaripatto Kadagiti Agtutubo Year 1 and 2

Panagtaripatto is an Ilocano word meaning to care, and Agtutubo in Ilocano is youth. Caring for the youth is the main objective of the project which was conceptualized year 2021. The beneficiaries of the project are selected 14 junior and senior high school students from Barangay Sugcong, Urdaneta City. It is a service-learning program wherein the youth experienced providing services in the barangay at the same time acquired new learnings from the various colleges and departments, the project also encouraged the youth to conduct community service like assisting the Barangay Health Workers in the health center in registering patients, sorting and filing health cards of the women and children patients, assisting the Barangay Officer of the day in registering clients and maintaining orderliness of the barangay Reading Center.

The Panataripatto Kadagiti Agtutubo (PTO) project one of its objectives is to assist needy youth in fulfilling their dream of entering into college education. These students are from Sugcong, Urdaneta City who undergone learning activities of the PTO project namely Princess Barrios (BSBA Marketing Management student), Rogie Mae Dingle (Midwifery student), Jovellano Crisolo (Criminology student) and Lovely Queen Kriszha Soria (BSBA Marketing Management student). They are one of the scholars of the university and the UCU Alumni Inc., for financial assistance every semester. Last May 16, 2023, they received their financial assistance of Php. 5,000 from the officers of the Alumni Inc. headed by Dr. Noel Ramirez, Alumni President. The beneficiaries were assisted by Brgy. Capt. Virgilio Magno and their parents while receiving their assistance.

With the good impact of the project, Panagtaripatto Kadagiti Agtutubo (PTO) Project Year 2 was launched last September 22, 2023, at Cabaruan National High School, Cabaruan, Urdaneta City. The beneficiaries are the Junior and Senior High School students. Learning sessions are based on the result of the Needs Assessment conducted. Same as before, every college and department are given schedules for two consecutive Thursdays from October 2023 to May 2024 in providing learning activities. The objective of the project is to give guidance and preview about different career paths the students may consider for their future college education and for other interventions. The College of Hospitality and Tourism Management was the first college to provide the learning sessions last October 20 and 27, 2023, they demonstrated to the students the Flambe’ making, Mocktails, and How to Become a Tourist Guide. Dean Mary Rose Uy, gave an overview of the CHTM course and possible employment after successfully graduating from the course. An actual demonstration of the preparation was discussed by the CHTM faculties and a demonstration from the chosen students on flambe and mocktail. Tourism students also demonstrated the proper gestures and articulateness of a tourist guide and an entertainment song. The second session is the demonstration on flower and balloon arrangement, table setting and table cloth folding, a return demo was given by the chosen students.

E) Badang: Bayanihan sa Unibersidad, Para sa Malinis na Paaralan Year 2

July 7, 2023, was the kick-off program of the Bayanihan sa Unibersidad: Para sa Malinis na Pasilidad Year 2, participated by the various colleges and departments, Student Council and various student organizations, UCU Kaagapay and partner stakeholders the 2nd Provincial Mobile Force Company and Every Nation Campus Ministry. The objective of the project is to instill bayanihan among the university personnel, students, and partner stakeholders in maintaining clean, safe, and student-friendly facilities. A warm-up Zumba dance were headed by the Criminology students before the simple program to boost the enthusiasm of the volunteers. Dr. Josephine S. Lambinico, VP of Academic Affairs shared some thoughts on the spirit of volunteerism and how we give importance to our students and love to our university. All colleges and departments faculties and their student organizations participated the activity and we were able to meet objective of the project whereby our university is ready to welcome our dear students with conducive facilities and surroundings.

F) Leadership Capability Training for Student Leaders of Cabaruan and Labit National High School attended by the

The Leadership Capability Training and Panagtaripatto Kadagiti Agtutubo project was launched last September 22, 2023 at Cabaruan National High School attended by the Senior and Junior High School students, a warm welcome by the CNHS teaching force. In lieu of Prof. Terry Sison, the speaker for the program, Dr. Jerry C. Dichoso shared thoughts about how to become a great leader with good moral values, followed by Christian values messages by Ptr. Ian Bulac and Ptr. Joe Rey Locquiao, NSTP faculties. Various extension coordinators and Dean Mary Rose Uy attended the program. The first session of the Leadership training was undertaken last October 6, 2023 at Cabaruan National High School and November 18, 2023 at Labit National High school, participated by the officers and members of the student organizations from grade 7 to Senior High School. Pastor Christopher Ian O. Bulac, LPT and faculty of the NSTP department, was the resource speaker and he focused on the Moral Values and Character Education. He introduced activity that encouraged the student on how to discern on their misdeeds, how to say sorry and how expressed their love to their families, friends, schoolmates and teachers. The second session was conducted last November 24, 2023 at Labit National High School with the topic "Public Speaking" with Mr. Harris Rubang as resource speaker. The students gained knowledge about the techniques and tips on how to become a good public speaker. A welcome message was given by Mdm. Luisita Antioquia, Head Teacher.

G) GAD Mainstreaming and Capability Building Training of Research and Extension Coordinators

Conducted GAD Mainstreaming and Capability-building training for Extension and Research Coordinators, a collaboration project of CCDES and CRD in coordination with the GAD Department. The resource speakers are from Pangasinan State University-Lingayen Dr. Randy Joy M. Ventayen, Director of Research and Development, his topic was on GAD Responsive Research and Extension Program, and Dr. Romary R. Lincod, Director of Gender and Development, Deputy Director for Administration Quality Assurance, her topic GAD Responsive Curriculum Program. A total of 41 participants successfully attended the training composed of Extension Coordinators, Research Coordinators, Program Heads, Deans, Directors and GAD coordinators. The top officials of the university graced the training sharing their inspirational messages for the participants. The opening program with messages from the Director of Research and Development Dr. Noel L. Guevara, Gender and Development Head Mdm. Flory C. Beltran, VP for Academic Affairs Dr. Josephine S. Lambinico, Acting VP for Administrative Affairs Atty. Michael Henry Sevilleja, and Acting University President Amihan April Mella – Alcazar. The training is under UCU-GAD budget and facilitated by the CCDES with the full support of Dean Ryan delos Reyes as the emcee of the whole day training.

H) Project Pulis and Project Pray Tech c/o CITE

The College of Information and Technology in partnership with the Center for Community Development and Extension Services launched Project Pulis which is devoted to empowering Police officers by sharing and aiding the digital gap in today's era, venturing to automation and in order to fulfill their task successfully with knowledge and skillful in computer skills. The series of sessions to be conducted is based on the result of the Needs Assessment conducted. Prior to the implementation, a Memorandum of Agreement was made between the UCU and the 2nd PMFC and strengthened the ties between the two institutions. Project Pulis: Cultivating Change for Prime Utilization of Literacy and Innovative Service through Technology is a series of seminar-workshop for police officers of the 2nd Provincial Mobile Force Company, Tayug, Pangasinan conducted last April 26, 2023 at the the CITE Computer laboratory. The second seminar is on cybersecurity with the resource speaker PLT. Sharmaine Jasse G. Labrado, CITE faculties – Mr. Patrick Mole, and Mr. Azriel Supsup. The opening program was graced by Dr. Jerry C. Dichoso, Director-CCDES, Dean Johanns B. Rabago, and VP for Academic Affairs Dr. Josephine S. Lambinico.

Last May 25, 2023, Project Pray-Tech MOA signing and Training Workshop was under. The project was conceptualized based on the request of EPASBC, a religious organization Baptist Church of Eastern Pangasinan on their desire to be trained in MS PowerPoint, Video Packaging, and Preparation of Live Stream Events which is very essential in their worship services. The project is in collaboration with the College of Information Technology Education, College of Arts and Sciences, MIS, and CTPD. A Memorandum of agreement was made between the UCU – College of Information Technology Education and the EPASBC. During the program Dr. Josephine S. Lambinico, VP for Academic Affairs, Dr. Jerry C. Dichoso, Director of Center for Community Development and Extension Services gave their messages and welcomed the trainees from the religious organization.

I) Badang Pasinaya para kay Lolo at Lola

The Center for Community Development and Extension Services, in coordination with UCU Alumni Inc., and Urdaneta City University Personnel Association (UCUPA) again spearheaded enjoining the generosity and support among the faculty, personnel, and student groups and organizations. For this year, the BADANG: Pasinaya Para kay Lolo and Lola was held last December 15, 2023 at barangay Tiposu, Urdaneta City, an adopted barangay. A total of 247 packs of assorted groceries containing biscuits, milk, sugar, coffee, canned goods, noodles, spaghetti set, oat meals and others were given to the senior citizens. A word of gratitude was given Mr. Nestor Mabilin, president of the barangay senior citizen association and all members of the association. Through the generosity of the UCU faculty, personnel and student organizations we were able to generate 247 packs full of assorted groceries. The program was highlighted with entertainment showcasing the talents of the women and senior citizens of the barangay and group dancing with the deans, department heads, Dr. Lambinico, Dr. Dichoso and Dr. Terry Sison, a raffle draw of cash and goods, and gift-giving. Our partner stakeholder, the 2nd PMFC Tayug extended their full support and in behalf of Company Corp Commander PLTCOL. Haron Rasid, Capt. Peter Escosio and his men graced the activity. They gave additional cash gifts for the raffle draw and free haircut. This is one way the Urdaneta City University family expressed its gratitude for the love and wisdom our elderlies have given.

J) Other activities:

- **Community Immersion of the students from Konan University, Kobe, Japan**

Students from the Konan University visited the University last February 24 to 27, 2023. Part of their activity is the community immersion program. The CCDES was tasked on the preparation of the community immersion program and we have chosen barangay Cabaruan and Oltama. They were welcomed by the officers and members of the Barangay Senior Citizens Association of Cabaruan and Oltama, barangay officials and barangay health workers. A simple program was made and a warm greetings was given by Mr. Prudencio Cabang, President of the Cabaruan Senior Citizen association, a message from our Acting University President, Dr. Amihan April Mella C. Alcazar, Dr. Josephine S. Lambinico, VP for Academic Affairs, Dr. Brent Jones, Professor, Konan University expressing their heartfelt thanks for the hospitality the barangay had given. Special song numbers were presented by the senior citizens, likewise the students of the Konan shared their traditional Kobe dance. Native rice cakes prepared in the barangay was served and the students and older person had fun in exchanging dances and songs. A flower offering was made at the Japanese Memorial Park, and they learned the history of the place during the World War II. The activity ended with a tree planting and vegetable planting program. The activity was also supported by the 2nd Provincial Mobile Force Company and UCU Kaagapay Riders who provided security on their way to the community.

- **Collaboration of CRD and CCDES proposed project on Hito and Aquaponics**

Last June 27, 2023, a site visit and collaboration with Pangasinan State University – Binmaley Campus College of Fisheries, Binmaley, Pangasinan was conducted by the Center for Research and Development, College of Engineering and Architecture and the Center for Community Development and Extension Services. The UCU team has undergone lectures, video

presentations, and site visits on the Hito project facilities provided by the faculty experts of the college headed by Dr. Marie Claire Briones and Dr. Aban. They have extended their technical support to the UCU for its endeavor to establish an aquaculture on Hito and hydroponics project.

- **MOA signing with Don Vicente Taaca Elementary School**

Another partnership with adopted school was conducted last November 27, 2023 with Signing of Memorandum of Agreement with Vicente Taaca Memorial Elementary School. Dr. Jerry C. Dichoso attended the MOA signing representing the UCU- CCDES. The School Principal Mdm. Nida S. Ramos extends her gratitude for accepting their school as one of the adopted schools of the UCU Center for Community Development and Extension Services.

- **World Universities Rankings for Innovations (WURI) – Social Responsibility Category**

With the guidance of Mdm. Rhea Agibuay and Dr. Sonny Soriano, the CCDES were able to comply with the requirements of the WURI and based on the evaluation results, we gained an over-all score of 87.8%. Accordingly, the project Badang demonstrates a multi-faceted and forward-thinking approach and showcases a commitment to leverage the technology for community engagement. In terms of implementation, there is a well-defined organizational structure with oversight from the CCDES and extension coordinators that ensures effective formal agreements such as the MOA underscored a sustained and wide-reaching impact. With the findings and recommendations for improvement, the CCDES will continue to abide and served the vision and mission of the UCU in the field of extension programs.

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
