VII. RATIONALE:

Based in the U.N. Convention on the rights of a child, the best interests of the child must be a top priority, the right to live in a family environment or alternative care and to have contact with both parents, health and welfare rights including rights for children with disabilities- the right to health and health care and social security, the right to education, leisure, culture and the arts. Children with special needs, recognizes that "children with disabilities should have full enjoyment of all human rights and fundamental freedoms on an equal basis with other children. It is also stated on the rights of every child:

- a) Their right to wholesome family life, the child's learning environment and teachers at their home and family. They are entitled to be a part of a loving family that will instill ethical values and morals in them.
- b) Their right to be raised well and become contributing members in the community, by raising them in a safe and loving environment, parents and guardians can shape the personalities of their young to be useful and contributing members of their respective communities when they grow older.
- c) Every child has the right to education, every child should have the means to go to a classroom and to have access to books and learning materials that can enrich their intelligence and skills.
- d) Every child has the right to play and leisure to engage in a wholesome recreational activity whenever they wish and not to be exploited.

Now a days, it has been observed that increasing numbers of children with cognitive, define behaviors and behavioral impairment (autism, learning disorder, mental retardation/slow learners, attention deficit disorders (ADD), attention deficit hyperactive disorder (ADHD), global developmental delays (GDD), intellectual and memory loss) also known as intellectual disability, a term used when a person has a certain limitations in mental functioning and in skills such as communication, self-help and social skills. These



limitations will cause a child to learn and develop more slowly than a typical child. If not properly assisted and managed, these poor children may become a victim of bullying, addressed to be an abnormal child, prevented from playing for they are judged to be destructive, out casted and worst is prevented them to go to school. They are even treated as burden among the family members and in the community. Some parents and families may deny and hide their child for they cannot accept due to social status, economic condition and lack of awareness on the proper intervention of their child's needs.

Study shows that the instant ways of living being practiced now a days, unhealthy foods, too much exposures of gadgets /computer games at an early age, lack of communication and supervision between the child and to his family is one of the causes of this child's situation, and if properly prevented through early detection, after-care and management, these children could be taken care of. Hence there is a need that parents of these children be given knowledge and skills in the home management and after care on the child.

VIII. OBJECTIVES:

General Objectives: To enable parents of Children with Cognitive and Defined Behavioral Problems, barangay stakeholders and teachers in the assessment and proper management of children through coordination, provision of trainings and assistance on the proper care and teaching of this children to become socially, physically and emotionally productive.

a) Specific Objectives:

- Protect the rights and freedom of children with cognitive and defined behaviors to be provided proper detection, assessment and management;
- To help strengthen awareness of parents, teachers, stakeholders in the school in the assessment and detection and after-care of children with the above-mentioned situation;
- To integrate strategies, facilitate and promote therapeutic learning and mental health programs of the Urdaneta City University through the Center for Community Development and Extension Services, Psychological Assessment and Counseling Center and other colleges;
- 4) Strengthen information systems, evidence and research for therapeutic learning and mental health specifically on the situation of children with cognitive and defined behaviors.

IX. PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Related University Extension Program:

The Urdaneta City University through the Center for Community Development and Extension Services and Psychological Assessment and Counseling Center will provide trainings and equip parents of school children in the management of their children with cognitive and defined behaviors in the adopted schools. To further sustain the project various partnership programs from different colleges shall become training background of the university students:

a) Psychological Assessment and Counseling Center and College of Human Sciences

 provision of training and counseling to parents, partners of the parents in the assessment, and after-care of their children.





- b) College of Arts and Science the CAS students could formulate and help in the advocacy on the awareness of the community on the detection and prevention as well as responsibilities of parents and the community on the promotion of child's rights.
- c) College of Teacher Education and P.T. Orata Library could provide learning facilities, creative skills and play activities for children based on the developmental domains of children. These activities will surely help the parents in assisting the children developed their expected developmental domains.
- d) College of Health Sciences provision of health services, maternal and child care services, training and seminars on child care especially for children with special needs.

Committee, Task and Responsibilities:

- a) Center of Community Development and Extention Services responible in the planning. implementation, coordination,networking and evaluation of the program and recommends other extension services and activities
- b) College of Human Sciences, Pscychological Assessment and Counseling Centerresponsible in the provision of counseling to parents in the assessment and after-care of their children. Referrals in the management of the children with special needs as well case management and evaluation on the effectivity and efficiency of the services extended.
- c) College of Arts and Sciences conceptualize child friendly advocacies on the awareness of the community on the detection and prevention as well as responsibilities of parents and the community on the promotion of child's rights.
- d) College of Teacher Education and P.T. Orata Library conceptualize learning facilities, creative skills and play activities for children based on the developmental domains of children and could recommend to the parents' techniques/strategies in the management of learning styles of their children at home
- e) College of Health Sciences provider of health services, maternal and child care services, training and seminars on child care specially for children with special needs. Discuss to the parents and teachers' other observations/recommendations that will redound to the best health of the school children
- f) Parents and Children the beneficiaries of the proposed project and their full cooperation on the program will redound to the efficiency and effectivity of the project.

XI. MONITORING AND EVALUATION:


The UCU Administration and the proponents will ensure proper supervision, implementation, monitoring, evaluation, and documentation of the said activity.
