

The "PANAGTARIPATTO KADAGITI AGTUTUBO" PTO PROGRAM, is a service-learning opportunity that connects youth to service learning and enables them to personality development and career planning. "Panagtaripatto" is an Ilocano word meaning "to take care or to value" and "Agtutubo" is the youth. One way of valuing the youth is to enhance their skills, potential, and capabilities, and enable them to prepare themselves and discern for their future. Service learning is a method under which the youths learn and develop through active participation in a thoughtfully organized service that they are learning for themselves and learning the needs of the community. The activity is a venue for the youth beneficiaries to improve character values and responsible behavior, they can generalize what they learn from their experiences, learn how to be respectful towards others and toward public service, and they develop an awareness of healthy life choices. As per the study, youth involved in volunteerism, interaction, and providing valued services in the school and community, have shown academic gains and motivations to pursue their studies and developed a sense of connectedness to the school, family, and community such as:

- Feeling valued by peers, school, and community
- Feeling responsible for their own welfare, their family, and the community
- · Prepared themselves to discern their future career

The PTO program will also promote the social-emotional skills of the youth. Accordingly, researchers have found a statistically significant impact on the youth such as improved social skills, low levels of delinquent behavior, good leadership in the school, and improved psychological well-being.

At the end of the" Panagtaripatto Kadagiti Agtutubo Year 2 Program", the senior high school students of Cabaruan National High School will be able to:

- 1. Do better in school and are less engaged in risky behaviors;
- Acquired knowledge, attitudes, and skills of an exceptional student and service provider in their school;
- Help them enhance their leadership capabilities and develop a sense of being a good leader in their school and in their community;
- Appreciate the efforts and good leadership in their school and volunteers in their community
- 5. Assist the students in their career planning as they enter into college education
- 6. Encourage students to pursue their college education at our university














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### I. PROGRAM OBJECTIVES:

These activities aim to:

- Strengthen the outcomes based curricula of the Bachelor of Science in Nursing.
- 2. Intensify the knowledge of nursing students in conducting Health Education Class.
- 3. Develop the leadership skills of nursing students in organizing and preparing Health Education Class.
- 4. Enhance the awareness of residents/participants about tuberculosis, immunization and rabies.

### **II. NARRATIVE REPORTS**

We've discovered through experience that sharing brings great enjoyment. Along a journey, caring for others forces you to reflect on who you are. Being able to lend a hand to others is a privilege for students like us because it shows us how to care for people who are deeply in need, how to embrace the spirit of generosity, how to share what we have, and how to get rid of the selfishness that lies deep inside of us. In keeping with the College of Nursing's monthly event, we conducted Tuberculosis, Immunization and Rabies Outreach Program held on April24, 26 and 28, 2023, in Barangay Camanang, Urdaneta City.

The Level 4 student nurses of Urdaneta City University (UCU)had an opportunity to host, organize and facilitate a community outreach program held at Camanang covered court and Camanang Elementary School in Barangay Camanang, Urdaneta City, Pangasinan wherein the topic raised is about Tuberculosis, Immunization and Rabies Awareness. The programs were mainly attended by Residents of Barangay Camanang and Grade 5 and 6 together with their parents, teachers, and principal. The programs were a half-day long each day which begins in the morning and consisted of lectures, games, ice breakers, and food giving for the students. The lecture covered its history, how it is transmitted, how it spreads inside the human body, where it came from, what is its manifestations, how to prevent, management, the law associated, different immunizations and benefits of having it. This was mainly discussed by student nurses and sufficed by the personnels from City Health Office and Urdaneta District Hospital, who is specialized in the area of Tuberculosis. Immunization and Rabies, to increase awareness residents/participants about the said topics. The games held in the program were eagerly participated in by the participants as there were prizes for each game. The prizes vary from ball pens, chocolates, towels, tumblers, to slippers. The prizes, food, and drinks were funded by the student nurses and their respected clinical instructors. Overall, the experience from this community outreach program is not only enjoyed by the participants but also by the student nurses and all who are involved. It left a stage full of learning, fun, and delight. Truly, it was a wholesome rejoiceful experience.













#### What about people who cannot be immunized?

Some people in our community cannot be vaccinated. When you get vaccinated, you are playing an important role in keeping yourself and your community safe. When enough people in the community are vaccinated, the spread of a disease slows down or stops completely - this is because the disease cannot move easily from person to person.

#### Possible side effects

- Immunization keeps us safe from many infectious diseases, but, just like any medication, we may experience side effects after our vaccinations.
- Side effects after immunization are mostly mild and usually last one to two days.
- The common side effects are fever (that is, a temperature over 385 °C), redness, swelling, and tenderness around the area where the needle went in to the skin. Sometimes, a small, hard lump (nodule) at the injection site may persist for some weeks or months. This should not be of concern and requires no treatment. Babies may be unsettled or sleepy
- after immunization.



#### Managing side effects

- · Drink extra fluids.
- . Do not overdress children or babies if they are hot.
- · Put a cold wet cloth on the injection site to ease discomfort.
- · Although routine use paracetamol after vaccination is not recommended, if fever or pain at the injection site is present, paracetamol can be taken. Check the label for the correct dose or speak with your pharmacist, (especially when giving paracetamol to children).











inclusive education, equipping its students with the tools they need to make meaningful contributions to the field of healthcare.



# No Smoking Policy for Urdaneta City University (UCU)

#### Purpose:

The Urdaneta City University (UCU) is committed to promoting a healthy and safe environment for students, faculty, staff, and visitors. This policy establishes a smoke-free environment across all university premises to enhance the quality of campus life and support the health and well-being of the entire UCU community.

#### Scope:

This policy applies to all students, faculty, staff, contractors, and visitors on UCU premises, including but not limited to buildings, outdoor spaces, walkways, parking lots, university-owned vehicles, and other areas within the campus.

#### **Policy Statement:**

### 1. Prohibition of Smoking

Smoking of any kind, including the use of cigarettes, cigars, pipes, electronic cigarettes (e-cigarettes), and vaping devices, is strictly prohibited on all UCU premises, including:

- Classrooms, laboratories, libraries, and offices
- Cafeterias, restrooms, hallways, and stairwells
- Outdoor areas such as gardens, open spaces, and walkways
- Parking areas and all university-owned vehicles

# 2. Enforcement of the Policy

Campus Security and designated staff are authorized to enforce this policy. Violators will be reminded of the policy and may face disciplinary action as outlined below. UCU will post "No Smoking" signs at visible locations around the campus to remind everyone of this policy. Students, faculty, and staff are encouraged to report any violations to Campus Security to ensure compliance.

### 3. Consequences of Violation

Violations of this No Smoking Policy will result in:

**First Offense**: Verbal warning and educational materials on the health risks of smoking.

















**Second Offense**: Written warning and required participation in a smoking cessation program.

**Third and Subsequent Offenses**: Disciplinary action, including but not limited to suspension or fines, depending on the severity of the offense.

#### 4. Support for Smoking Cessation

UCU is committed to supporting students, faculty, and staff who wish to quit smoking. The university provides access to smoking cessation resources, including counseling and referral to local health programs. Information on these programs will be available through the university's Health Services.

# 5. **Compliance and Review**

UCU will regularly review the No Smoking Policy to ensure its effectiveness and to update it as necessary. Community members are encouraged to provide feedback to help improve the policy's implementation and reach.

Urdaneta City University is dedicated to creating a smoke-free campus to protect the health and safety of all members of its community. We encourage everyone to respect and adhere to this policy and to work together toward a cleaner, healthier, and safer environment for all.
